SHOW RULES

1. All exhibits in Sections 1 & 2 to have been grown by the exhibitor or, if purchased, have been owned for at least 6 months. All exhibits in Sections 3-8 to be work of the exhibitor. The Committee reserve the right to exclude any entries.
2. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any exhibit.
3. Exhibitors may only enter one exhibit in each class.
4. Entries in Sections 5, 6 & 7 must not have been shown before at Harmer Hill Village Show.
5. All food items entered in Section 4 must be covered.
6. Exhibits not as scheduled will be disqualified.
7. Any decision of the judge is final.
8. All exhibitors to attach the tickets provided.
9. All the exhibits are to be made on the official Entry Form.
10. Exhibits to be staged on show day between 9.30am and 11.30am
11. Any dispute - the decision of the Show Secretary will be final.
12. All entries in all classes, with the exception of the Junior Section, will be 50p per entry.
13. Points will be awarded as follows in all sections:
1st - 5 points 2nd - 3 points 3rd - 1 point
14. Sponsored Classes have cash prizes of : 1st £5, 2nd £3, 3rd £2
15. Junior Classes have cash prizes of 1st £2, 2nd £1, 3rd 50p

Set Recipe for Carrot Cake (Class 43)

250 ml sunflower oil *4 large eggs*
225g light muscovado sugar *200g carrots, coarsely grated*
300g self-raising flour *2 tsp baking powder*
1 tsp mixed spice *1 tsp ground ginger*
75g walnuts, chopped, plus 8 halves to decorate

For the icing:

50g butter, at room temperature
25g icing sugar *250g full-fat cream cheese*
a few drops of vanilla extract

Preheat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Grease two deep 20cm round sandwich tins and line the bases of the cake tins with baking parchment. Put the oil, eggs, and sugar into a large mixing bowl. Whisk until the mixture is well combined, lighter, and noticeably thickened. Gently fold the carrot into the cake batter, then stir in the flour, baking powder, mixed spice, ginger, and chopped walnuts until evenly blended. Spoon the mixture evenly between the tins. Put the cakes in the oven and bake for about 35 minutes, or until golden brown, risen, and shrinking away from the sides of the tins. Transfer to a wire rack to cool.

For the icing: Put the butter, icing sugar, cream cheese and vanilla extract in a bowl and whisk using a hand or electric whisk until smooth and thoroughly blended. Spread half the icing on one cake, sit the other cake on top, and spread the remaining icing on top to make a swirl pattern. Decorate the top of the cake with the halved walnuts.
